## ESSENTIAL INFORMATION BAHRAIN

#### PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for at least six (6) months after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of one (1) blank visa page for entry and exit stamps.

A tourist visa is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Bahrain. There are currently two options available as outlined below. Buongiorno Travel recommends a visa on arrival.

**Visa on Arrival:** A tourist visa can be obtained on arrival at the Bahrain International Airport (BAH) and King Fahad Causeway land border. The current fee for a single-entry visa is 25 Bahraini Dinar (approximately USD \$70.00) subject to change without notice. The fee <u>must</u> be paid in cash in either U.S. dollars or local currency. If payment is made in U.S. dollars, change will be given back in local currency.

**Electronic Visa (eVisa):** To apply for an eVisa, visit <a href="http://www.evisa.gov.bh/">http://www.evisa.gov.bh/</a>. The current fee for a single-entry visa is USD \$75 (subject to change without notice.) Read and follow all instructions carefully to ensure a smooth arrival in Bahrain.

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

#### **VACCINATIONS**

A yellow fever vaccination is only required to enter Bahrain if you are arriving from, or have transited through, a yellow fever-endemic area in South America or Africa. The CDC and WHO each provide a current list of all affected countries. If vaccination for yellow fever is necessary, you must carry an International Certificate of Vaccination provided by your physician; you may be denied entry without it. If your physician advises against receiving the vaccination because of your personal medical history, he or she can provide you with the necessary documentation for the country/countries you are visiting.

#### **CASH & CREDIT CARDS**

Cash transactions should be made in local currency. Major credit cards are widely accepted for goods and services. Access to ATM machines is widespread in cities and towns, but may be limited in rural areas.

#### OF SPECIAL NOTE: ALCOHOL IN BAHRAIN

Alcoholic beverages are widely available for non-Muslim adults in most high-end restaurants and hotel bars. However, the possession and/or consumption of alcohol in public outside of these establishments is prohibited and punishable by law.

### PACKING LIST BAHRAIN

Clothing

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Temples, mosques and other religious sites require conservative dress. Both sexes should cover their arms, legs and shoulders (women should pack a scarf for this purpose.) Wear or carry a pair of socks when sightseeing, since shoes must be removed when visiting certain religious sites.
