ETHIOPIA

PASSPORT AND VISA INFORMATION

Your passport needs to be valid for **at least six (6) months** after your journey ends, and should have a minimum of one (1) blank visa page for entry and exit stamps.

A tourist visa is required for U.S. and Canadian passport holders for entry into Ethiopia.

There are currently two options available as outlined below. Buongiorno Travel recommends an electronic visa.

Electronic Visa (eVisa): To apply for an eVisa, visit www.evisa.gov.et. The current fee for a single-entry visa, which is valid for 30 days, is USD \$52 (subject to change without notice). The validity of an eVisa starts from your date of arrival in Ethiopia, not from the date of issuance. Read and follow all instructions carefully to ensure a smooth arrival in Ethiopia. *Please be aware that eVisas are only valid for entry at Bole International Airport (ADD) in Addis Ababa.*

Visa on Arrival: Tourist visas can be obtained on arrival at Bole International Airport (ADD) in Addis Ababa. The current fee for a single-entry visa is USD \$50 (subject to change without notice.) The fee must be paid in cash and one (1) passport-size photo is required. *The U.S. Department of State advises against using this option due to unreliable visa on arrival procedures and reports of significant wait times.*

Citizens of other countries should contact the appropriate consular office for entry requirements pertaining to their journey.

VACCINATIONS

A yellow fever vaccination is only required to enter Ethiopia if you are arriving from, or have transited through, a yellow fever-endemic area in South America or Africa – including East African countries such as Kenya and Uganda. The CDC and WHO each provide a current list of all affected countries. If vaccination for yellow fever is necessary, you must carry an International Certificate of Vaccination provided by your physician; you may be denied entry without it. If your physician advises against receiving the vaccination because of your personal medical history, he or she can provide you with the necessary documentation for the country/countries you are visiting.

STAY HEALTHY ON THE ROAD

Because of Ethiopia's high elevations, you may experience altitude sickness. Please consult your healthcare provider for suggestions on prevention and treatment.

CASH & CREDIT CARDS

Ethiopia has a cash-based economy. Cash transactions can be made in either U.S. dollars or local currency. U.S. dollars should be recently issued bills in smaller denominations. Major credit cards are accepted on a very limited basis, mainly in the largest shops, hotels and lodges. Access to ATM machines is available in Addis Ababa but limited in rural areas.

PACKING LIST & BAGGAGE RESTRICTIONS

BAGGAGE RESTRICTIONS

On flights within Ethiopia, each passenger is limited to 1 piece of checked luggage with a maximum weight of approximately 44 pounds (20 kilograms). Total dimensions of checked bags must not exceed 62 inches (158 centimeters.) Dimensions for checked baggage are calculated by adding together the width, height and depth of the piece of luggage. For carry-on baggage, each passenger is limited to 1 piece of luggage with a maximum weight of approximately 15 pounds (7 kilograms). Dimensions of your carry-on bag should not exceed 9 inches (23 centimeters) x 15 inches (40 centimeters) x 21 inches (55 centimeters). In addition, each passenger may carry on a personal item with a maximum weight of 11 pounds (5 kilograms).

Please use the provided Buongiorno Travel luggage tags, even if your bags already have ID tags. This makes it easier for Buongiorno Travel staff to collect and manage your luggage for you.

PACKING LIST

Choose versatile, casual clothing that can be layered if the weather (or level of air-conditioning) requires. Smart casual attire is appropriate for evenings. Formal clothing is not necessary.

Beachwear or other tight or revealing clothing is not appropriate street wear in Ethiopia. Local people dress conservatively and appreciate visitors who do the same.

Churches, temples, mosques and other religious sites require conservative dress. Both sexes should cover their arms, legs and shoulders (women should pack a scarf for this purpose.) Wear or carry a pair of socks when sightseeing, since shoes must be removed when visiting certain religious sites.
